II. IDOLS OF THE HEART

An idol is something or someone we allow to **CONTROL** us

III. IDOLS DESCRIBED AND DEMONSTRATED

- A. Idols are a matter of **WORSHIP** –
- 1. He is talking about the EVERYDAY affairs of men -
  - First God contrasts...what it means "to <u>LOVE</u> the Lord your God"
  - Then He describes...commands as: "your HEART turns away"
  - Finally He wraps...they "are drawn away and WORSHIP other Gods ..."
- 2-b 12:2 Jeremiah tells God that the Judeans are HYPOCRITES
- 2-c 12:3 "but you know me, O Lord, You see me; and you examine my HEART'S attitude..."
- 2-d **13:10** God defines their behavior as **IDOLATRY**

The sin of daily life has its **ROOTS** in worship

- 3-a **SIN** is a heart issue:
  - 3-a-2) Rom 1:18-32 -...because our "foolish heart was DARKENED." 21
  - 3-a-3) Mk 7:21-23 Jesus depicts the heart as **SOURCE** of sin
- 3-b Jas 1:14-15 Sin begins with the **DESIRES** of the heart
- 3-c **Heb 4:12 –** The **WORD** pierces the heart

- 4. Desires of the heart need to be addressed for **LASTING** change
