An idol is something or someone we allow to _____ us in a way that only God should.

A. Idols are a matter of _____ – we bow before them in service.

1. God describes idols of the heart to Moses

DT 30:15-17 “See, I have set before you today life and prosperity, and death and adversity; in that I command you today to love the Lord your God, to walk in His ways and to keep His commandments and His statutes and His judgments...but if your heart turns away and you will not obey, but are drawn away and worship other gods and serve them...”

He is talking about the _____ affairs of men.

2. God describes idols of the heart to Jeremiah.

a. **JE 11:1-10** God judges Judah

"**3**...‘thus says the Lord, the God of Israel, “Cursed is the man who does not heed the words of this covenant **4** which I commanded your forefathers in the day that I brought them out of the land of Egypt, ... **5** in order to confirm the oath which I swore to your forefathers, to give them a land flowing with milk and honey... **8** ‘yet they did not obey or incline their ear, but walked, each one, in the stubbornness of his evil heart;... **10**...they have gone after other gods to serve them; the house of Israel and the house of Judah have broken My covenant which I made with their fathers.”"

b. **12:2** Jeremiah tells God that the Judeans are _____.

"You are near to their lips, but far from their mind."

c. **12:3** Jeremiah describes it as a heart issue as he compares himself to Judah.

"...but you know me, O Lord, you see me; and you examine my _____ attitude toward you."

d. **13:10** - God defines their behavior as _____.

"This wicked people, who refuse to listen to My words, who walk in the stubbornness of their hearts and have gone after other gods to serve them and to bow down to them..."

Basic Principle: Desires of the heart ultimately _____ our attitudes and behavior.

IV. THE BENEFIT OF IDENTIFYING IDOLS

A. Idolatry addresses the person at the most basic level.

PR 4:23 "Watch over your heart with all diligence, for from it *flow* the springs of life."
 "springs" – "The basic notion of *YĀṣA* (the Hebrew word) is "to go out.""

The New International Dictionary Of New Testament Theology (vol. 2, p 182), defines heart as - "It is simply the person."

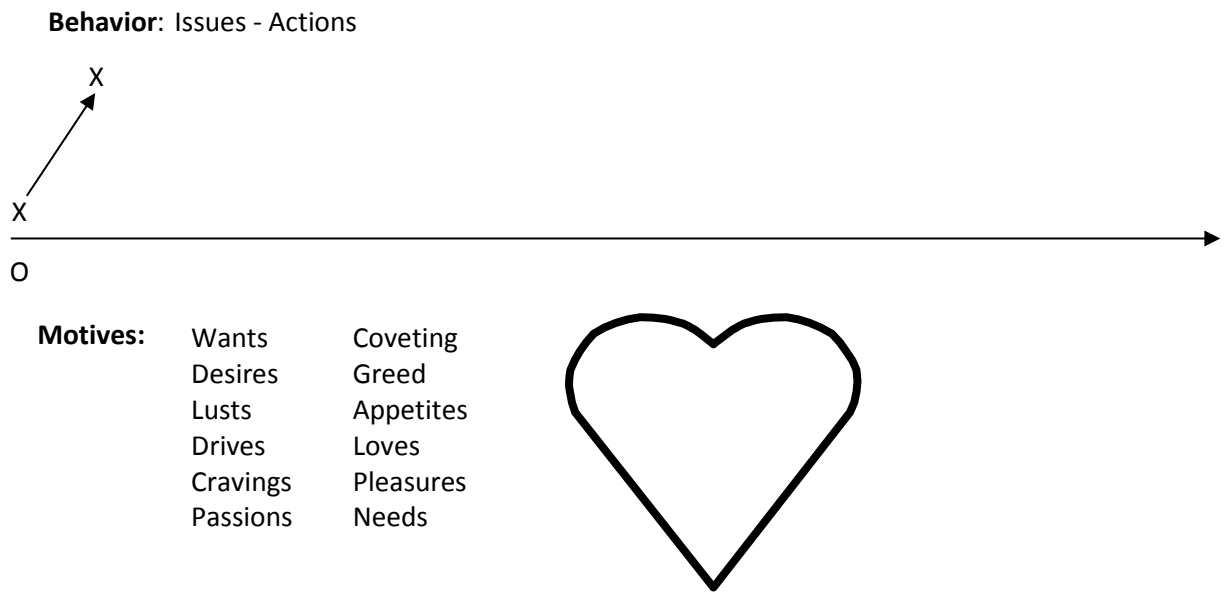
