- I. The Contrasting Views of the Cross v. 18
  - A. To those who are perishing, it is foolishness
  - B. Those who are being saved, it is power
    - 1. The past saved from the penalty of sin
    - 2. The present saved from the power of sin
    - 3. The future saved from the presence of sin
- II. The Futility of Man's Wisdom v. 19
  - A. This is a quote from Isaiah 29:14
  - B. The people foolishly listened to the "wise"
- III. The Emptiness of Man's Wisdom vv. 20-21
  - A. Verse 20 is a paraphrase of Isaiah 19:12
  - B. No one comes to know God through human wisdom
- IV. The Masks of Unbelief v. 22
  - A. Jews seek more signs Matt. 12:38-44
  - B. Greeks seek wisdom or human reasoning
- V. The Message of Christ vv. 23-25
  - A. Is a stumbling block to Jews, foolishness to Greeks
  - B. To those who are called, it is power and wisdom 1 Cor. 1:9, Rom. 8:30, 2 Tim. 1:9
  - C. God's "foolishness" and "weakness" are superior to man's "wisdom" and "strength"
