4.	In verses 9-10, Paul expresses his desire to see the church of Corinth grow to maturity in Christ. Should we have a similar desire for our fellow church members? Explain.
5.	Of the six commands found in verses 11-12, which one do you believe you should give the most attention to? Where are you weakest?
