- III. The Refusal to Compare with Others vv. 12-18
  - A. It is a lack of understanding and isn't wise
  - B. Paul never saw himself as better than others

  - C. Paul ministered in his God-given sphere
  - D. He desired to take the gospel further Acts 19:21; Romans 15
  - E. His Boast was in the LordPhil. 3:5-8; Jer. 9:23-24; 1<sup>st</sup> Cor. 1:30-31
