The following are questions designed to facilitate greater learning and deeper understanding of spiritual truths presented in the sermon "**Pierced In The Heart.**" All of the questions are answered as the sermon is given. We hope that it will be a catalyst to spiritual growth in your life.

1. What had the Holy Spirit done with believers in the early part of Acts 2?
