- A. They were a shadow v. 1
- B. They were ongoing v. 2
- C. They were a reminder of sins v. 3
- D. They could not take away sins v. 4- Hebrews 8:7-12 (Jeremiah 31)

II. The Obedience of Jesus in His Sacrifice vv. 5-8

- A. A quote from Psalm 40:6-8 in the Septuagint
- B. God delights in a pure heart Isaiah 1:11
- C. Jesus, far greater than David, loved God's will
- D. The sacrifices were prescribed but not God's delight

III. The Effects of the Jesus' Sacrifice vv. 9-10

- A. It brought an end to the OT sacrifices v. 9
- B. It sanctified all believers v. 10
 *this is positional sanctification 1st Cor. 1:30
