- I. The Heinous Betrayal by Judas vv. 43-46
 - A. He betrayed Jesus with a kiss
 - B. Jesus still called him "friend" (in Matthew)
- II. The Impetuous Act by Peter v. 47 A. He cut off the servant's ear
 - B. Jesus rebuked him (Matthew's gospel)
- III. The Probing Statements by Jesus vv. 48-49a A. He made it clear that He was innocent
 - B. He made it clear they were unjust
- IV. The Fearful Actions of the Disciples vv. 49b-50 A. The Scriptures would be fulfilled
 - B. The disciples all fled (in Matthew)
- V. The Unknown Follower vv. 51-52 A. Possibly Mark himself
 - B. He escaped capture and fled naked
