3.	What did Paul mean when he said that he "preached Christ Jesus" in verse 19?
4.	In verse 20, what does it mean that "all the promises of God in Him are Yes"?
5.	Looking at verse 22, what does it mean to be sealed with the Spirit?
6.	Additionally, how does the Holy Spirit function as a pledge?

- 9. Paul appealed to the Corinthian believers to be genuine in what?
- 10. Did Paul consider it onerous/burdensome to visit the Corinthians?
- 11. How do we know Paul was comfortable in his relationship with the Corinthians?
